## St Mary's Churchyard wildflower project

Thanks to villagers who kindly donated cowslips, primroses, violets and wild strawberries. These were planted out at the end of February, then a mix of (predominantly) oxeye daisy and native wildflower seeds were sown. The area will not be cut again until the summer.

It was decided to seek advice from Suffolk Wildlife Trust regarding the Hedgehog & Invertebrate Habitat, which looks guite untidy as it's basically a bonfire pile!

## **Trees at the Allotments**

An email from the Woodland Trust informed that the March delivery date would now be changed to an April delivery, which is not ideal as the weather will be warming up and the young trees will need more watering! Unfortunately the options offered were to accept the April date or cancel the order and reapply for a November delivery. Following discussion with the WI committee it was decided to go ahead, so the saplings will be arriving between 9th and 19th April and will be in place for the WI Centenary in November this year.

Six members of Glemsford WI have offered to help with planting (Covid regulation Rule of 6 will be in place in April).

## **Blister pack Recycling**

Terracycle are running a nationwide Medicine Packet Recycling Scheme. Any brand of empty blister pack medicine can be dropped off at a participating Pharmacy. Superdrug in Sudbury are signed up to this. If we want to set up our own village public drop-off location it must be with a pharmacy registered to the scheme.
