





BABERGH DISTRICT Report To Glemsford Parish Council For PCM on 12/11/13

This report covers the period from **08/10/13 to 12/11/13.** During this time there has been **7** crimes recorded within the parish, this compares to **16** crimes for the same period last year.

BREAKDOWN OF CRIME

Burglary Other Building 2 Reports

At 0440 on 02/11/13 4 x young male suspects were disturbed breaking into a garden shed on Kings Road. . SU/13/2180 Pc 1834 Knibbs

At 0430 on 03/11/13 The post office in Fair Green was rammed by a stolen vehicle which was left in situ. A standalone cash machine appears to be the centre of attention. Arrests have been made. SU/13/2191 Pc 1253 Lingwood

The volumes of crimes recorded within Glemsford this month are lower compared to the same period last month. However the burglary other building that took place at the village post office has had a great impact on the community. Reassurance visits have been carried out with the victims, witnesses and local business. All post offices within Babergh West have also had a reassurance visit by members of the Babergh West Team. High visibility patrols within the village have been increased in order to offer further reassurance to residents and local business owners. Although arrests have been made, police are urging residents to still make contact if they have any information relating to the incident in order to help the investigation.











We continue to urge all residents to be aware of any suspicious activity and to please call the Police with any information you may have.

If you see any suspicious vehicles driving slowly around your area and they seem to be out of place then please try to take down their registration numbers and pass these onto the Police by dialling 101 the non-emergency number, if it is an emergency you are to dial 999.

Please keep your homes and vehicles as secure as possible, make sure all windows and doors are securely locked and if you are going out for the evening, try to leave a light on down stairs and upstairs to give the impression that somebody is home.

Due to the increase in the theft of CATS you can try and protect them by the following means:

CAT Marking is available from Red Star Woodhall Business Park, Sudbury, CO10 1WH Tel 01787 880998 this costs approximately £12.00.

Install a catalytic converter protector. They come in several forms and usually consist of either a cage or a cable that clamps over the catalytic converter to keep it attached to the car under carriage. While not foolproof, the devices do make it more difficult to remove the converter, making thieves more likely to look elsewhere.

Park in well-lit areas at night. Thieves prefer to work in darkness so they won't be seen while crawling under the car to saw the converter off. Street lamps provide a deterrent since they make it more likely the thief will be spotted.
