Hello, for those that I have not yet been in contact with, I would like to introduce myself as the new Inspector for Babergh. I have now been in post for one month having replaced Insp Paul Crick in late July 2014.

I just wanted to update you on the news that Pcso Siobhan Hemmett has been successful in her recent application for a twelve month secondment to a new role based in Bury St Edmunds. The role will involve Siobhan looking at how the Police respond to Mental Health in order reduce the huge demand that this area of work places on our service. Siobhan starts her new role at the start of September.

Whilst Siobhan is away, other officers from the West Babergh Safer Neighbourhood team will step in to cover your area so that the impact will be minimal. The main change will be that a different officer will attend your local community meetings. I can assure you that this officer will be from the same team and so will already have a good idea of the issues that currently







affect your area. This may take a few weeks to put into place as officers will need to add new dates to their diary's. There is no change to the 24 hour Police cover which will still be maintained by our response teams based at Sudbury and Hadleigh.

If any item of registered property is lost or stolen report it to Immobilise via your online account. This information is then made available nationally to all the major UK Police forces through their online systems.

#### REUNITE

If your registered property is recovered either the Police or Immobilise will contact you and let you know its location.

## **Neighbourhood Watch**

- Greater vigilance
- Rapid and detailed reporting of crime and suspicious incidents to the Police
- Fostering an improved community spirit.

There are many schemes throughout Babergh, and we are keen for parish councils to promote benefits of Neighbourhood Watch in their community, and ultimately for every parish to have at least 1 scheme operating, with as many members of the community involved as possible.
