Outbuildings broken into - Little Waldingfield

Police are appealing for witnesses after a number of outbuildings were broken into in Little Waldingfield.

Between 6.30pm on Sunday 26 October and 7.30am on Monday 27 October in Church Road;

- An outbuilding was forced and a leaf blower and hedge cutter stolen from within.
- Entry was forced to a garage but nothing was stolen.
- A garage was broken into and stolen a man's Cannondale racing bike from within.
- A further attempted burglary of an outbuilding also took place within these times.

Between 6pm on Saturday 25 October and 4pm on Monday 27 October in The Street, an offender has attempted to gain entry to wooden shed but not successful.

Also in The Street at approximately 1.30am on Monday 27 October, a resident was awoken by a noise and later found entry had been forced to two garden sheds and a red can of petrol stolen.

Catalytic converter marking days - Bacton and Sudbury

Officers from Mid Suffolk and Babergh are holding two free catalytic converter marking sessions to help reduce further crime.

Both are taking place on **Saturday 8 November**:

- Mid Suffolk at Lamberts Service Station in Shop Green, Bacton from 9am to 12pm.
- **Babergh** at Setyres in Woodhill Business Park, Sudbury from 8.30am until 12.30pm. Please note: smaller vehicles should arrive between 8.30am and 10.30am and vans/ larger higher vehicles between 10.30am and 12.30pm.

Motorists are advised to consider the following advice to protect their catalytic converters, in particular owners of vehicles with a high ground clearance which are often targeted:

- Park your vehicle in a locked and secure garage/compound at all times.
- The use of alarms, lighting and CCTV should be considered to deter thieves.
- If this isn't possible park in a well-lit, public area.
- Vehicles can be parked in such a way as to make access to the catalytic converter difficult, or parallel with another vehicle if you own one.
- Look out for people 'working' under vehicles as they may not be the owners or lease holders, even if they have fluorescent jackets on.
- Remove items of value from your vehicle whilst unattended and keep it secure and locked at all times.
- Mark your catalytic converter by etching your vehicle registration onto the metal shell, or by using a Secured By Design (SBD) approved forensic marking solution which is a heat-resistant paint. This makes it easier for police to trace the converter back to your vehicle should it ever be stolen, and links offenders to a crime.
- Consider fitting additional security on your vehicle(s) by installing an SBD approved converter security product, such as a clamp.
