Outbuilding security advice

As you can see from the crimes listed in this newsletter, there has been a spate of thefts and attempted thefts from outbuildings.

Take a look at the following advice:

- Perimeter: As far as possible ensure all access gates are secured/locked with a quality closed hasp padlock and if required crop resistant chain. Ensure nothing is left outside that may aid an offender to commit crime against you or a neighbour.
- Lighting: If mains power is available then a Bulk head Fitment protected by a wire cage supported by a Dusk to Dawn sensor may help to deter offenders.
- Timber Framed Outbuildings: Secure with a closed hasp and shackle Padlock secure with nonreturn screws/coach bolts, these can be secured internally with additional timber and oversized washers. Internal cladding is also an option.

- Windows: Obscure with old net curtains or blinds and reinforce with mesh.
- Alarms: If mains power is not available there are a number of quality battery alarms on the market that can be programmed to give both an audible or silent alert and text messages can be sent to up to 5 mobile phones warning of a compromised outbuilding. Always immediately notify the Police on 999 on receipt of an alert.
- High Value Tools/Equipment: Should ideally be stored in a lockable cage/cabinet. If the building has a concrete floor then items can be padlocked and secured to a "Ground Anchor".
- Mark/Register/Record/Images: There are a numerous methods of marking everything from UV pens, Paint, Etching, and Grinding. Register your property on www.immobilise.com ideally add images. Have a record of make, serial numbers and identifying marks and an easily accessible image.
- Report: Please promptly report any suspicious/unusual activity promptly direct to the Police on 999, it may just save a crime taking place.
- NHW: Join or start a Neighbourhood Watch scheme in your area.
